PRIVATE MODEL	MCO – SOLO COUNTY	LTC DISTRICT
<p>Features:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Private corporation (for profit or non-profit) operates model • County does <u>not</u> have authority over Family Care operations • County bears no financial risk or legal risks • If it chooses to the County will <u>likely</u> have a role as a service provider • County <u>may</u> negotiate an advisory role • Employees will likely come from existing staff as well as outside sources • Current service providers will likely have continued opportunities for contracts 	<p>Features:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • County has <u>complete</u> authority over Family Care operations, including quality assurance and policy • County bears 100 % of financial risk and legal risks • County will have a role as a service provider • Employees will likely come from existing staff as well as outside sources • Current service providers will <u>likely</u> have continued opportunities for contracts • County Executive appoints all board members • County is responsible for setting up the infrastructure necessary to operate Family Care • Safeguards are established to avoid conflicts between MCO and County Operations 	<p>Features:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • LTC District has <u>complete</u> authority over Family Care operations, including quality assurance and policy • County does <u>not</u> have authority over Family Care operations • County bears no financial risk or legal risk • If it chooses to the County will <u>likely</u> have a role as a service provider • County <u>may</u> negotiate an advisory role • County Executive appoints all board members • Employees will likely come from existing staff as well as outside sources • Current service providers will <u>likely</u> have continued opportunities for contracts
<p>Benefits:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Less \$ risk to Dane County • If non-profit, more consumer control possible • Program services are less vulnerable to impact from Dane County budget • Selected provider will ready have infrastructure in place • Many of same providers/caregivers are likely to stay in business 	<p>Benefits:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • More government oversight – potentially gives more stability • Elected representatives provide greater chance/influence to resolve conflicts • Smoother staff transition and chance to maintain current roles • County has long history of obtaining public input in defining services and policy • Many of same providers/caregivers are likely to stay in business 	<p>Benefits:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>May</u> allow access to broader array of services • Employees will have compensation similar to what is in place now • Allows for contracting back to County • Many of same providers/caregivers are likely to stay in business
