**Schools of Hope:** Supports the Madison Metropolitan School District's efforts to prepare middle school students for high school algebra by recruiting, screening, training, and matching tutors with underachieving students. Each student also determines an educational, artistic, athletic, or technological savings goal that they would like to achieve. Common Wealth then opens a custodial savings account for program participants where their deposits are matched 2:1. Students are required to make minimum monthly deposits in order to encourage goal-directed behavior. Due to limited funding of match dollars participants must be economically eligible, i.e., qualify for free or reduced lunch via the school district.
